


Governance in eHealth

- And how does the Norwegian national eHealth governance model act as a legitimate governance tool to realise the vision of "One citizen - one Journal"?




Knowledge gap



Phase 1

- Idea of a strong governance model based on co-governance
 - Inbuilt tension between vertical and horizontal governance
- Phase 2
- Visible tension between vertical and horizontal governance
- The actors are losing trust in the governance model
